Accomplishments in Citrus County

County Administrator Randy Oliver recently gave a "State of the County" address to local business owners and community members, highlighting the accomplishments achieved in our County this year. The Board of County Commissioners



awarded \$20 million for road resurfacing, which includes paving 80 miles of residential roads. Design and property acquisition for Phase 1 of C.R. 491 is underway. County officials and staff worked with the City of Inverness on property exchange of Amerigas site and easement of

land to construct a better access road for the airport and associated business park. Citrus County was one of only 11 counties in the sate to lower the property tax rate and reserves has been restored to almost 15 percent. The County implemented a uniform rate structure for utilities and received money from a portion of the RE-STORE Act. Internally, the County moved to an electronic agenda process and all

payroll and paystubs will be electronically distributed. Tourism has seen an increase and the Visitors & Convention Bureau moved into the new Welcome Center on U.S. 19. County staff is working to streamline the building permit process. Oliver stated he appreciated the hard work of County staff in continuing to provide a high level of customer service to the citizens of Citrus County and is looking forward to another year of success moving into 2016.

Brighter Economic Outlook

There are several upcoming projects that will add to the economy in Citrus County. The Duke Generating Facility, a \$1.4 billion project, is slated to begin soon as well as the Suncoast Parkway 2. Widening of U.S. 19, re-build of Halls River Bridge, and continuing County road projects all provide jobs and opportunity for expansion in our community. Kings Bay clean up efforts will make our waters more attractive to tourists and the gas line to the Duke Energy facility will provide news jobs. Oliver will continue to encourage county officials and staff to identify economic development objectives as we move forward.

County Offices Closed for Christmas Holiday

Citrus County Government offices will be closed Thursday, December 24 and Friday, December 25 in observance of Christmas. The county landfill will be open until 2:30 pm on Christmas Eve and closed on Friday. All library branches will be closed both days. All Community buildings and pool will be closed on both days. Parks and boat ramps are open from sunrise to sunset. Animal Services will be closed both days, but will return to normal operating hours on Saturday, December 26.





During a recent FDOT inspection, it was discovered that the white runway markings were yellowing and no longer met the retro-reflectivity standard. On May 26, 2015, the Board of County Commissioners approved an agreement to correct this situation in the amount of \$54,000, of which the County's share was \$10,800. The work was completed on October 30.

Residential Mulch Program is now available

Solid Waste Division is now offering free course and fine mulch to residential customers starting December 5. On Tuesday through Friday, staff will be available from 9:00-10:00 am to load mulch for citizens, and Saturdays from 8:00 am to 2:00 pm. If citizens do not require assistance, they may visit during regular landfill business hours. Citizens are required to have a



tarp to cover the mulch in their vehicle and are asked to use Lane 1 when arriving at the landfill to receive mulch. For more information, please contact Solid Waste Division at 527-7670.
